Have your passport ready as you enter the fascinating world of the Creoles who, at this historic site, lived apart from the American mainstream for over 200 years.



Explore the rigors of 200 years of daily life, along with the sobering experience of slavery as it happened on this sugarcane plantation.

Marvel at the highly skilled workmanship of slave artisans and the ancient treasures of Creole America's unique traditions and folklore.



At Laura Plantation, see the largest collection of family artifacts original to a Louisiana plantation, including clothing, toiletries, business and slave records, Mardi Gras and mourning heirlooms.

Tour starts every 40 minutes. Allow at least 70 minutes.

Visit Laura's 160-year-old cabins where west-African folktales of Compair Lapin, known in English as the legendary "Br'er Rabbit," were recorded.

Laura hosts 12 buildings on the National Register surrounded by fields of sugarcane, vegetable and fruit gardens and formal French parterre.
